3.1 EMERGENCY OVERVIEW

3.2 POTENTIAL HEALTH EFFECTS

Eye Contact:

SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1 FIRST AID PROCEDURES

5.3 PROTECTION OF FIRE FIGHTERS

SECTION 6: ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Accidental Release Measures: Evacuate unprotected and untrained personnel from hazard area. The spill should be cleaned up by qualified personnel. Ventilate the area with fresh air. For large spill, or spills in confined spaces, provide mechanical ventilation to disperse or exhaust vapors, in accordance with good industrial hygiene practice. Warning! A motor could be an ignition source and could cause flammable gases or vapors in the spill area to burn or explode. Contain spill. For larger spills, cover drains and build dikes to prevent entry into sewer systems or bodies of water. Working from around the edges of the spill inward, cover with bentonite, vermiculite, or commercially available inorganic absorbent material. Mix in sufficient absorbent until it appears dry. Collect as much of the spilled material as possible using non-sparking tools. Collect as much of the spilled material as possible. Place in a closed container approved for transportation by appropriate authorities. DO NOT wipe spill or residue with cleanup materials containing cotton.

SECTION 7: HANDLING AND STORAGE

7.1 HANDLING

Avoid eye contact with vapors, mists, or spray. Avoid breathing of vapors, mists or spray. Do not eat, drink or smoke when using this product. Wash exposed areas thoroughly with soap and water. Keep away from heat, sparks, open flame, pilot lights and other sources of ignition. Avoid contact with oxidizing agents. Keep out of the reach of children.

7.2 STORAGE

Store away from acids. Store away from heat. Store out of direct sunlight. Store away from oxidizing agents. Store away from flammable and combustible materials.

8.1 ENGINEERING CONTROLS
